Since 2006, thanks to various Edinburgh religious groups, including **the Central Mosque, St Mary Episcopal Cathedral, and Nicolson Square Methodist Church**, Edinburgh businesses and individuals, three groups from Edinburgh — representing the city's diverse faith communities and those of no faith — **Hope-into-Homes** fundraised and helped to build homes for twenty seven families in Kyrgyzstan and Hungary.



Hope into Homes received the backing of both the Edinburgh Interfaith Association and Habitat For Humanity.

In 2008, **Hope into Homes** plans to send teams to three Habitat for Humanity projects in Malawi, England and Kyrgyzstan.

Poverty housing – let's nail it

Between January and August 2008, the teams will have to raise money through inter-faith

social activities such as a chocolate party, an Ceilidh, a concert, an interfaith football tournament and a food fayre. Join us.

Objectives: To use the positive energy from Scotland's diverse cultural and faith groups to build bridges between communities in Scotland and to help families to build their future

Projects: We are looking for volunteers to help families in difficulty to build their own houses and avoid falling into extreme poverty. No building experience is necessary.

Fundraising is part of the experience. Fundraising will help to cover the cost which includes transportation, food, accommodation, tools and a contribution towards building materials. Each volunteer is expected to help the group to raise the funds to achieve these projects.

MALAWI

It is the first year that we are planning to send a team to Malawi. We need a minimum 6 people to form a team. The project take place during the first two weeks in September.



KYRGYZSTAN

The group will work with local families to build their homes in the Bishkek area. Each day lunch will be provided on site with the families and accommodation will be in rental flats in the nearby city centre. This trip includes three days of rest and recreation. The team will go for 2 weeks in late June/early July 2008.



ENGLAND

We are looking to send a team for 4 days to Liverpool to support the Habitat for Humanity project there. Poverty is also down the road.
